As you read last newsletter, I recently purchased the cup pictured because I loved the idea of learning from and being motivated in my walk with Jesus by "Women of the Bible." While we have all likely heard of most of the women on the cup, I thought some of you might want to join me on this journey to discover more about each woman and the phrases associated with them. Thank you for the kind words about the first two articles! This is the third of the series of articles focusing on one of the women from the Bible listed on the cup!



"Serve Like Martha"

I don't know about you, but I was kind of surprised to see Martha made the cup. I mean, Martha was the one who, while cleaning and cooking for everyone, interrupted Jesus to question why her sister, Mary, was sitting at Jesus' feet rather than helping Martha. Jesus even rebuked her. So, why would they have included Martha? Was it a typo? Did they really mean "Serve Like Mary"? Or is there more to Martha? Is it possible she's someone worth emulating?

Yes, in Luke 10, Martha gets distracted by her serving—she has welcomed Jesus and several others into her home and wants to be hospitable. She's anxious and frustrated, and Jesus gently corrects her: "Martha, Martha, you are worried and upset about many things, but only one thing is necessary. Mary has chosen what is better..." Ouch, right? It sounds like Jesus is elevating Mary's choice to sit and listen over Martha's work in the kitchen. But here's the thing: Jesus never told Martha to stop serving—He corrected her heart, not her hands.

Fast forward to John 11, and we meet Martha again—but this time, it's a different scene. Her brother Lazarus has died. When Jesus arrives, it's Martha who runs out to meet Him while Mary stays at home. And what does Martha say? "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that whatever You ask of God, God will give You." That's faith. That's belief. And then comes one of the most profound declarations in Scripture—Martha says, "I believe that You are the Messiah, the Son of God, who is to come into the world." This isn't a woman lost in distraction. This is a woman who knows who Jesus is.

So maybe it's not "serve like Mary" after all. Maybe "Serve like Martha" means something deeper. Serve with diligence, yes—but also with faith. Serve without anxiety. Serve while still believing in the miraculous. Martha teaches us that service is necessary and good—it just needs to be rooted in trust, not worry. In a world that glorifies hustle but forgets to honor the heart behind it, Martha reminds us that serving matters—but how we serve matters even more.

So yeah—maybe she did deserve the cup after all. Hopefully we will all learn to Serve like Martha—with our hearts full of love and trust in God.
