

"Cast all your anxiety on Him because He cares for you." – 1 Peter 5:7 This verse has been our anchor as we walk through our current sermon series, *Anchored: Secure in a Shifting Culture*. As you have read, I recently purchased the cup pictured because I loved the idea of learning from and being motivated in my walk with Jesus by "Women of the Bible." While we have all likely heard of most of the women on the cup, I thought some of you might want to join me on this journey to discover more about each woman and the phrases associated with them. So, this is the third of the series of articles focusing on one of the women from the Bible listed on the cup!



"Dance Like Miriam"

In Chapter 14 of the Book of Exodus, the Lord told Moses to lead the people of Israel, who were enslaved in Egypt, out of Egypt. Moses did as he was told and the Israelites followed him into the desert. The Lord said he would show the Egyptians that he was the Lord and to do so, he hardened the heart of the King of Egypt and the King sent "six hundred chosen chariots" and "pursued after the children of Israel." The Egyptians who pursued after the Israelites overtook them as they were encamping by the sea. At that point, the Israelites were, perhaps understandably, questioning Moses' insistence that they leave Egypt and some were regretting having left—feeling uncertain and scared, in fact, "they said unto Moses, because there were no graves in Egypt, hast thou taken us away to die in the wilderness?"

But Moses reassured the Israelites and, as we all know, the Lord told him to go the sea and "lift thou up thy rod, and stretch out thine hand over the sea, and divide it: and the children of Israel shall go on dry ground through the midst of the sea." AND IT WORKED! The people of Israel were safe on the other side when the Egyptians "went in after them to the midst of the sea, even all Pharaoh's horses, his chariots, and his horsemen" and then the sea engulfed them. The threat was gone—the Lord had taken away the source of their angst and had saved their lives!

What a stressful and trying time for the Israelites! And when it ended, when God saved them, what happened? Did they celebrate? Did they give thanks? Exodus 15 tells of their celebration with verses 20-21 detailing,

"And Miriam the prophetess, the sister of Aaron, took a timbrel in her hand; and all the women went out after her with timbrels and with dances. And Miriam answered them, Sing ye to the LORD, for he hath triumphed gloriously; the horse and his rider hath he thrown into the sea."

Miriam, the first women in the Bible to be called a prophetess, began to celebrate the Lord's miracle with her tambourine and dancing! And the other women were inspired to do the same! They worshipped with all their being—celebrating God with joy! And what an awesome experience it must have also been for those who watched them as well!

Like Miriam, we should not hesitate to worship God with all our being! We should find joy in our blessings and be moved to display our faith! So, grab your tambourine and Dance Like Miriam! (or for any non-dancers, be motivated by Miriam to worship with all your being in your own way!)
